

500 Days – Photographs



125th Field Artillery Photographs 500 days provides a look into some of the experiences of the 125th Field Artillery during WWII. The 125th had the longest continual combat deployment of any unit in WWII – just over 500 days. The 125th also had a disproportionate number of northeastern Minnesota men and boys (who lied about their age to sign up after Pearl Harbor) serving their entire tour together, because the 125th was not split up and deployed to various locations, as was common military practice. The exhibit is comprised of 14 identically framed black and white photos taken by local veterans of the 125th, plus introductory text, and sponsor panels.
