Wayne Gannaway comes to the SLCHS from the History Center of Olmsted County in Rochester where he served as Executive Director. "(His) approach to programming, public engagement and community outreach (is) finding multiple entry points to illuminate stories and experiences: emphasizing different angles, perspectives and ways of knowing; and asking questions and providing participants opportunities for feedback and dialogue."
